PAVILION INFORMATION AND RULES

Chief Steward: David Hill

- **All Pavilion judging will take place on Thursday, 12 November 2026.** Check each section for closing times for exhibit entry.
- You **must** have a separate entry form for each section. Multiple entries in one section can be on the one form.
- The **A. & I. Hall** is referred to as '**the Pavilion**' for the duration of the annual Bangalow Show.
- The Pavilion opens at 7:00am on Thursday, 12 November 2026 for exhibit entries in sections 7, 8, and 9.
- In all other section's entries may be delivered from Monday 2nd November to the Show Office.
- Stewards have the right to move exhibits if they deem it is in an incorrect class.
- The Pavilion will be open for viewing on Friday, 13 November from 9:00am and all Pavilion exhibits will remain on display until approximately 4:45pm on Saturday, 14 November 2026.
- Please do not remove certificates from display. All prize winners are listed in the Show Office.
- The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit, or if the exhibits are not considered 'worthy'.
- **Pavilion prize monies may be collected from the Show Office on SATURDAY, BETWEEN 10:00am AND 5:00pm ONLY. There will be NO prize money available to be collected other than at the allocated time.**
- Prize money must be collected by the winner, or in the case of a minor, a parent or guardian. Identification may be required.
- All unclaimed prize money will be returned to the Show Societies funds.
- Pavilion exhibits may be collected on **Sunday morning, between 8:00am and 10:00am.**
- **There will be NO prize money collected on Sunday.**
- Exhibits in Horticulture, Preserves and Farm Produce will be donated to the Farm Produce Auction unless otherwise advised. Please inform the Stewards if your exhibit is to be returned, and a green dot will be placed on the exhibit card.
- Cooking exhibits, except for Fruit Cakes, will no longer be allocated to the Farm Produce Auction due to the earlier judging time. If you do not wish your fruit cake to be included in the auction, please advise the Steward when entering and a green dot will be placed on exhibit card. All other cooking exhibits not picked up on Sunday will be disposed of.

NOTE: Due to the earlier Judging time, only Fruit Cakes will be included in the Auction on Saturday afternoon. All other exhibits must be picked up on **Sunday between 8:00am– 10:00am** or they will be disposed of. If you wish your fruit cake to be held back from the Auction, please ask a Steward to place a **green dot** on the exhibit card when entering.

CONDITIONS:

1. All cakes to be made by the exhibitor – no packet cakes
2. All cakes will be cut through by the Judge
3. Exhibits are to be presented on white paper plates.
4. Exhibit cards NOT to be attached to exhibit with pins
5. Point Score: First 5 points, Second 3 points
6. *Certificates and exhibits not for Auction may be collected from pavilion on **Sunday between 8:00am – 10:00am**. Please note that exhibits not picked up will be disposed of.*
7. Collect prize money from Show Office **Saturday between 10:00am and 5:00pm ONLY**
8. **Entries must have a separate form for each section**

HINTS FOR EXHIBITING:

- Never turn your cake onto a wire cake cooler, the marks will be regarded as decoration. Place your cake on tea towels.
- Do not trim your cake
- Storing your cake in plastic containers or bags prior to judging may draw moisture. For best results use cellophane.
- For 'show judging' slices should be 5cm x 3cm and best not to exhibit edge pieces.
- If baking for competition in weeks prior to show, leave cake out to cool until you are sure there is no heat left within the cake before freezing. Defrost the cake the day before entry, preferably overnight and then iced if necessary.
- When 'Show Baking', "cook as though you are baking for the Queen."

1kg mixed fruit (no peel or cherries)	125g raisins	125g currants
1 cup slivered almonds	1 cup brandy	½ cup canned crushed pineapple
1 med granny smith apple, grated	250g butter , softened	½ cup caster sugar
2/3 cup light brown sugar, firmly packed	4 eggs, med	½ cup self raising flour
½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda	2 teaspoons mixed spice	120g blanchd almonds to decorate

Method:

Combine dried fruit and ½ cup of brandy in a large bowl. Cover and store in a cool , dark place for 5-7 days, stirring each day.

Preheat oven to 150°C (125/130 °C fan forced). Grease a 22cm round deep cake tin and line with three layers of brown or baking paper, extending 5cm above rim.

Stir slivered almonds, pineapple and grated apple into fruit mixture.

Beat butter and sugar together until creamy. Add eggs one at a time, beating until combined.

Add creamed mixture to fruit mixture, mix well. Stir in sifted dry ingredients.

Spread mixture evenly into pan and tap several times on bench to settle mixture.

Decorate with blanchd almonds.

Bake for 3- 3 ½ hrs or until a fine skewer inserted into centre comes out clean.

Leave in tin to cool.

250g sultanas	½ teaspoon almond	½ teaspoon ground ginger
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	125 g chopped mixed peel	4 large eggs
250g butter	¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg	90 g chopped blanched almonds
250 g plain flour	½ teaspoon vanilla essence	½ teaspoon ground cloves
250g soft brown sugar	90g chopped red glace cherries	½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
250g currants		
60 g self-raising flour		

RECOMMENDED METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. **NOTE:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 -3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

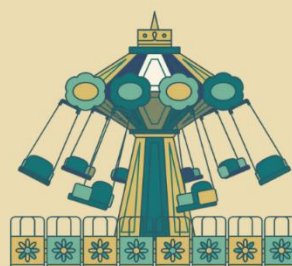

- The liquid covers the product and there is little or no floating product (pips etc)
- **JELLIES:** Jars 250ml to 375ml size; to be clear free of sediment or pulp, no bubbles or foam holds shape – not rubbery or syrupy.
- **JAMS:** Jars 250ml to 375ml size; natural colouring, smooth, uniform throughout, spreadable tastes of the nominated fruit.
- **MARMALADES:** Jars 250ml to 375ml size; fine shreds of peel tender and evenly distributed, citrus aroma, spreadable not syrupy, flavour is important.
- **PICKLES AND RELISHES:** Jars 250ml to 375ml size: spreadable (not too dry), evenly cut, bite size pieces, medium thickness, flavour and general appearance are all important.
- **PANTRY COLLECTION:** Judged visually only – do not cover with cellophane. *Consistency of size and shape of bottles and jars is important. *Use pouring bottles for sauces/oils/cordials.

CONDITIONS:

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a) Garment: an item that can be worn eg. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
 - b) Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home eg. Blanket; with an outfit eg. Bag; for amusement eg. Toy; as decoration eg. Picture etc
 - c) Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or purpose: **eg.1.** A knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy **OR eg.2.** a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy **OR eg.3.** a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
2. All articles/garments must contain a minimum of, 80% SHEEP wool, excluding lining, to qualify for competition.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be handcrafted (use of machine is not permitted).
4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals or an organisation.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local Show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local Show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
12. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable).
